# **Courses aim and teaching methods**

The Virtual Spanish immersion courses aim to provide the foreign exchange student with the necessary communication skills to effectively interact with other speakers in Spanish. Accordingly, the course will provide students with activities that foster active learning and promote problem-solving skills.

In the **Elementary course**, students will find topics such as greetings and introductions, descriptions of people and places, asking for the menu and going shopping, and reporting daily routines.

## **Current aim of course**

- **1.** To identify the information found in short texts, monologues and simple conversations related to everyday life situations by using oral and written texts.
- **2.** To communicate orally and in writing everyday life and family situations using short and simple phrases to use first, the present simple tense, and then the present continuous form.
- **3.** To clearly convey likes and dislikes using verbs, verbal locutions, adverbs, and appropriate adjectives.

### **Tuition fees**

USD \$100. Tuition fee includes two weeks course plus digital course material.

# **Teaching methodology**

Classes will take place via Zoom. The tutors will make sure to strongly direct the communicative and interactive aspects of language during class to promote students' interaction.

### To this end, the tutors will make use of:

- **1.** Role-play activities: by using breakout rooms, the tutor will encourage pair-work interaction in which students take turns, share ideas, and drill each other.
- 2. Teacher-student interaction (teacher-student and teacher-group).
- **3.** Oral and written practice of the lexical, grammatical, and communicative aspects of language learning, as well as awareness of the cultural context in which the language is expressed and used.
- **4.** Practice and presentation of vocabulary and new expressions.
